The Rediscovery Centre is the national centre for the circular economy and it supports the development of the circular economy and advocates for a more resilient, equitable society. Our centre in Ballymun has transformed the iconic Ballymun Boiler House into a 3D textbook; a novel interactive experience and learning environment designed to stimulate curiosity in the natural, physical and cultural environment and promote sustainable living for the circular economy. The Rediscovery Centre is very active in the field of environmental and STEAM education. The Rediscovery Centre offers a range of education workshops for primary and secondary school students, which focus on interactive, practical learning about environmental issues. The school workshops are linked to the national curricula and are based on hands-on enquiry and experiential learning tailored to class requirements. Workshops are offered in the Rediscovery Centre's Boiler House in Ballymun or onsite outreach workshops in schools covering topics related to science, technology, engineering, art and maths (STEAM).

We are currently seeking enthusiastic and flexible individuals with a passion for environmental education to join our panel of Environmental Education part-time facilitators.

The Role

Reporting directly to the Education Programme Manager, the Environmental Education Facilitator role will relate primarily to deliver and facilitation of primary and second level environmental education workshops.

The role will include but will not be limited to:

- Delivery of Rediscovery Centre's primary schools workshops in schools, libraries and at other events in the Leinster area (mainly but not restricted to Dublin, Meath, Wicklow, Kildare)
- Delivery of Rediscovery Centre's second level schools workshops in schools, libraries and at other events in the Leinster area (mainly but not restricted to Dublin, Meath, Wicklow, Kildare)
- Ensuring the professional delivery of all Rediscovery Centre's education programmes

- Preparation of materials for workshops
- Supervising Rediscovery Centre interns where present
- Ensuring the completion and submission of an evaluation form to the Rediscovery Centre for each workshop delivered.
- Adhering to all operational plans as directed by the Education Programme manager and Education Officer
- Safe and timely return of all educational resources and equipment.
- Having regard to all applicable environmental, health and safety policies
- Other activities as direct by the Education Programme Manager
- Other tasks as the Rediscovery Centre may reasonably direct from time to time.

Terms and conditions of employment

This is a part-time flexible hours contract of service, subject to the ongoing requirements of the Rediscovery Centre's Education team. Some work outside normal office hours will be required from time to time. The role is seasonably variable due to school demand.

Fees will be paid at a daily flat rate scale, which is dependent on the number of hours of workshop delivery. Access to own transport is essential for outreach workshops.

The Application Process

Based on the information contained in the CV and cover letter, the interview committee will select candidates for interview. Shortlisting and interview decisions will be based on the committee's assessment of candidates' qualifications, experience and skills in the following areas:

Academic qualifications:

- Third level qualification in environmental science, science communication, teaching or other relevant qualification.

Experience:

- Proven experience in environmental education
- Experience working with children

Skills:

- Excellent facilitation skills, especially with young people
- Excellent communication skills, both oral and written
- Knowledge of the primary and/or secondary curricula and programmes such as Green Schools
- Full clean driving licence and access to own transport **is essential**

- The ability to inspire and motivate children and adults to engage with the environment, science, engineering and maths
- Strong IT skills (Microsoft Word, Powerpoint, Outlook and Excel essential)
- Knowledge of or a strong interest in environmental issues and sustainability
- Strong organisational skills, excellent interpersonal skills, a flexible and enthusiastic approach to work, professional and reliable
- Competency in Irish would be an advantage
