#### **LATEST NEWS:**

- The Irish government has published 'A Waste Action Plan for a Circular Economy'. This progressive action plan goes beyond waste to support prevention, reuse and repair objectives that will provide a more robust and resilient waste management system for the future. The Rediscovery Centre's reaction is covered in this month's spotlight.
- For the first time, solar power projects at scale will be rolled out in Ireland.
   The <u>recent announcement</u> of successful auction bids under the State's new renewable energy support scheme (<u>RESS</u>), confirms this significant development in power generation.
- <u>Circular online</u> has announced that L'Oréal UK and some of Ireland's biggest brands have launched new campaigns to drive forward education for consumers on sustainability and recycling.
- In the UK, <u>Aldi</u> has also announced that from Sept 24th they will refill its own-brand cleaning liquid spray bottles up to four times saving an estimated 550 tonnes of single-use plastic a year, a first in the supermarket industry.
- Founded by environmental experts, hairdressers and eco campaigners, <u>GREEN SALON COLLECTIVE</u> has been launched in the

target of retrofitting over 500,000 homes to an efficient building energy rating (BER) of B2 by 2030, An Post launched its <u>Green Hub</u>. This onestop site has been designed for people looking to improve their homes' energy efficiency and is offering green loans of between €10,000 and €75,000 at rates starting at 4.9 per cent APR.

 Council & the Government of Ireland is also nominated for the LIFE

## **FUNDING**:

- To respond to the urgency and ambition of the European Green Deal objectives, Horizon 2020 launched a call worth almost €1 billion. The call contains 20 areas and will close on 26<sup>th</sup> January 2021. A call info day and brokerage event will take place at the <u>virtual European Research and</u> <u>Innovation Days</u> on 22-24<sup>th</sup> September.
- The <u>EPA Research Programme</u> will consider applications for the financial support of small workshops, seminars, and other events which showcase current Irish research by the organisers and EPA funded-groups. Funding up to €3,000 is available per event The next deadline is 30th September.
- The upcycle challenge is still open for entries until 30<sup>th</sup> October. This year
  a few more categories have been added.
- Applications for the <u>Sustainable Development Goals Action</u>
   <u>Awards</u> remain openuntil 9<sup>th</sup> October. The 2020 edition is seeking creative, scalable and transformative initiatives worldwide that mobilize, inspire or connect.
- The EPA is funding and administering the research call for <u>Climate</u> <u>Change Advisory Council Research Fellowships</u> on behalf of the Climate Change Advisory Council. The deadline for application is on 9<sup>th</sup> October <u>5pm</u>. One award is expected under each of the following topics:
  - Carbon Budgeting Research Fellowship
  - Mitigation Research Fellowship
  - Adaptation Research Fellowship

scheme supports research actions, conference and workshop development, and creative approaches to the communication of scientific concepts and/or complex societal challenges.

 WeDesign launched <u>Future Fashion Now</u> in collaboration with the UN and the Ellen MacArthur Foundation, in order to rethink how the fashion industry works. The competition is opened to all, with different categories and prizes and closes on 30<sup>th</sup> of September.

#### **RESEARCH & REPORTS:**

- The European project "System Dynamics for Circular Economy" is looking
  for stakeholders who work along the value chain or life-cycle of electric
  and electronic equipment; fashion textiles; and furniture. Participation is
  limited and is on a first-come-first-served basis.
- A public consultation on the green claims initiative has been launched by the European Commission and is open until 3<sup>rd</sup> December.
- The Ellen MacArthur Foundation launched a new report on <u>Financing the</u> <u>Circular Economy – Capturing the opportunity</u>.
- The Circle Economy has investigated the link between resilience and the Circular Economy in its most recent <u>report</u>.
- The EEA's latest publications provide:
  - an overview of plastics that often are somewhat confusingly labelled as compostable, biodegradable, oxo-degradable and/or biobased in its briefing 'Biodegradable and compostable plastics — challenges and opportunities'.
  - an insight into how the environment influences health and well-being in Europe in a new report 'Healthy environment, healthy lives'.
- GreenBiz recently investigated <u>how digital identities could bring us closer</u> to a circular economy and <u>How AI and robotics are shaping the MRF of</u> the <u>future</u> and has also reviewed <u>emerging jobs in the Circular Economy</u>.

- <u>Electrical Vehicle Summit 2020 'Our Drive To The Future'</u> has been postponed to 15<sup>th</sup> October and is going virtual.
- Ireland's major environmental policy and management conference <u>'Environmental Ireland'</u> will take place as an online event on 15<sup>th</sup> & 16<sup>th</sup> October.
- The EPA will host a workshop on 28th October, as part of its ongoing consultation process for the to development of the EPA Research Strategy 2030..
